Conspiracy Against Stephen

- Accusers lacked the capacity to argue with Stephen
- Use of misinformation to manipulate the public to support a trial
- Strength of Social Capital/Fellowship
- "for we have heard him say that this Jesus of Nazareth will destroy this place and will change the customs that Moses delivered to us." Acts 6:14

Social Capital: networks of relationship among people in a particular society, enabling that society to function properly

Fellowship: Association amongst those with like interest





Stephen's History Lesson

- He does not run away, call out the lie, yell, kick, scream, fight, cry, etc.
- Speaking to the high priest,
 Sanhedrin assembly of rabbis
 (they don't need a history lesson)
- Abraham, Isaac, Jacob, Joseph, Moses, Joshua, David, Solomon



Stephen's History Lesson

Abraham:

- 1) Father of the faith
- 2) Did not have a temple
- 3) Wasn't always entirely obedient and did not benefit fully from God's blessings until he grew spiritually
- 4) Lived in faith manifestation of God's promises took a good long while



Stephen's History Lesson

Joseph and Moses:

- 1) Received favor from God from infancy
- 2) Rejected by their people
- 3) Used by God bring salvation to the very people who had rejected them

'God will raise up for you a prophet like me from your brothers.' Acts 7:37b

Acts 7:47-48; Numbers 14:1-4

Stephen Convicts His Accusers

Stephen calls out the crowd for:

- 1) Resisting the Holy Spirit (51)
- 2) Persecuting the prophets of the Lord (52)
- 3) Killing those who announced Jesus's arrival (52)
- 4) Killing Jesus (52)
- 5) Not keeping the law (53)

Jesus came for the sick Luke 5:31-32



Stephen Petitions for the Forgiveness of his Murderers

Stephen:

- 1) Declares the glory of God (56)
- 2) Asks for the Lord to receive his soul (59)
- 3) Petitions for those stoning him (60)
